## Girl's Best Friend



## MATERIALS

7 in. (18cm) bracelet

- 3g Japanese cylinder beads
- 4 mm bicone crystals 26 in color A 24 in color B
- toggle clasp
- Fireline 6 lb . test or Power Pro 10 lb . test
- beading needles, \#12


## Imitate the timeless look of the classic diamond tennis bracelet using Japanese seed beads, crystals, and right-angle weave.

## step $b y$ step

[1] Pick up eight cylinders and slide them $10 \mathrm{in} .(25 \mathrm{~cm})$ from the end of a $3-y d$.
$(2.7 \mathrm{~m})$ length of Fireline.
Sew back through the beads again and continue through the next two beads, pulling the beads into a tight circle (figure 1, a-b).
[2] Pick up an A crystal, skip the next pair of cylinders, and sew through the following pair in the opposite direction, so the crystal lies diagonally across the circle (b-c).
[3] Pick up six cylinders and sew back through the last two beads from the previous
step (c-d). Reinforce with a second thread path.
[4] Repeat step 2 (d-e) then sew through the next two cylinders (e-f).
[5] Repeat step 3, but continue through the next two cylinders (figure 2, a-b). This will offset the placement of the next two crystals.
[6] Repeat step 2, substituting a B crystal for the A crystal (b-c). All the crystals will lie in the same direction.
[7] Repeat step 3 (c-d). Reinforce the new circle with a second thread path and exit at point d.
[8] Repeat step 6 and sew
through the next two cylinders (d-e).
[9] Repeat steps 5-9, alternating between two color A and two color B crystals.
[10] To add the clasp modify the directions as follows: Add

the last crystal, but don't sew through the next two cylinders. Pick up one cylinder and half the clasp and sew back through the cylinder (figure 3, a-b). Reinforce the last circle with a second thread path, making sure to sew back through the clasp at least one more time. Secure the tail with half-hitch knots (Basics) between a few beads and trim.
[11] Repeat on the other end of the bracelet. ©

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
