BBJ2312-2 Katie's Beading Lesson Add Cording & Beads to Chain Designed by Katie Hacker

Materials & Tools:

10168489 4mm metal plated multicolor Bead Gallery® rounds

large-link plated chain with lobster clasp/jump rings

Beadalon Acrylic Tying Station http://www.beadalon.com/tools/216s-210.asp

Beadalon 1mm black cotton cord http://www.beadalon.com/cords_and_stringing/138Z-018.asp

Scissors, big eye needle

Instructions:

- 1. Determine how long you want the finished bracelet to be and then adjust the Acrylic Tying Station to that length (remember to account for the clasp).
- 2. Carefully connect the end links to the bolt/wing nuts at each end to hold the chain in place. Make sure the chain isn't twisted.
- 3. Cut a yard of cotton cord and thread it onto the needle. Tie it in a knot around the first chain link to attach it to the bracelet.
- 4. Begin stitching the cord onto the outer surface of the chain: Pass the needle through the chain link, then through the thread loop. Pull it tight to complete the half knot. Then, thread a bead and tie another half knot. Make another plain knot, then add another beaded knot. Repeat for the length of the chain on both sides.
- 5. Add a drop of GS Hypo Cement to each end knot on the bracelet.
- 6. Use a jump ring to attach the clasp to one end of the bracelet.
