Tip: Mix it up with different colors of bead rounds or focal beads, and try using the same tassel technique to make a tassel out of embroidery floss for lots of tassel fun!

Time to create: 2-3 hours

Length of necklace: 30" not including tassel

Instructions:

To Create the Tassel...

- 1. Remove suede lace from card and stretch to remove kinks.
- 2. Wrap lace around fingers until about 12" of cord is left. Cut lace.
- 3. Cut a piece 6" piece of wire and make a U shape with one side being about 1" long and the other 5" long.
- 4. Pass the wire through the loop of the laces so that the dip of the U cradles the loops of lace.
- 5. Make a wrapped loop to hold the lace in place and trim the end of the wire.
- 6. Use the 12" piece of lace to wrap around the top of the tassel. Make a knot so that the ends of the lace are trapped inside each other. Add a few drops of glue on either side of the knot where the lace is tied and let dry.
- 7. Slide the bead cap and cinnabar bead onto the long wire. Make a wrapped loop and trim excess wire.
- 8. Cut the loops of the lace to create the tassel's fringe.

To Create the Necklace...

- 9. Remove two strands of #6 silk cording with needle from the card. Stretch before using to remove kinks and prevent post-knotting stretching.
- 10. Holding both strands of the silk as one, tie a simple overhand knot about 2" from the end of the silk, at the very end of the 2m lengths of cord.
- 11. String a 32 aqua glass rounds and 8 aqua table cut Czech glass rounds.
- 12. Slide the first bead all the way down the cords to the knot.

- 13. Make an overhand knot and use the knotting tool to slide the knot as close as possible to the bead.
- 14. Use the thumb part of the tool to press the knot off the tool and next to the bead as close as possible.
- 15. Repeat this step for each of the strung beads, working your way down the prestrung beads.
- 16. When you get to the last bead, string 1 silver round, the loop from the tassel with the cinnabar bead and 1 silver round.
- 17. Make a knot with the knotting tool and string 8 aqua table cut Czech glass rounds and 32 glass rounds.
- 18. Knot remaining beads as before.
- 19. Finish the necklace by tying an overhand knot at the end of the necklace, holding all four strands of the silk as one.
- 20. (Optional) You may also add a clasp by using clamshell closures at the ends of the necklace with the clasp of your choice. Just string a clamshell with loop at the beginning and end of your necklace. Close the finding over the knot and add a clasp.
