## Charmed, I'm Sure

MATERIALS
bracelet $71 / 2 \mathrm{in}$. ( 19 cm )

- 4 mm bicone crystals 30 main color
26 accent color
- 128 mm lampwork beads (or any 8 mm beads or crystals)
- 8 five-point bead caps
- 16 4mm bead caps
- 84 mm spacers
- 82 -in. ( 5 cm ) head pins, 22-gauge
- 20 1-in ( 2.5 cm ) head pins, 22-gauge
- 2 crimp beads
- 7 3mm soldered jump rings
- 3 mm jump ring or split ring
- 12 in. $(30 \mathrm{~cm})$ flexible beading wire, .019
- toggle clasp
- crimping pliers
- wire cutters
- roundnose pliers
- chainnose pliers



## Make these fun and easy beaded charms with crystals, lampwork beads, and silver bead caps. by Bindy Lambell

## stepbystep

## Make the charms

[1] String an accent color (AC) crystal and a five-point bead cap (points up) on a 2 -in. ( 5 cm ) head pin.
[2] String a main color (MC) crystal on a $1-\mathrm{in}$. $(2.5 \mathrm{~cm})$ head pin. Make a small plain loop (Basics, p. 146) above the crystal. Slide the dangle onto the head pin prepared in step 1 and make sure the crystal sits in the bead cap as shown in photo a. Adjust the loop size if necessary. Make four more dangles.
[3] Stack the four crystal dangles on the head pin as in
step 1 (photo b). String a five-point bead cap (points down), arranging the dangles so they nestle between the points on the two bead caps (photo c). String an AC. [4] Start a wrapped loop (Basics) about $1 / 8 \mathrm{in}$. ( 3 mm ) above the AC, slide a soldered jump ring into the loop, and finish with 3 to 4 wraps at the base of the loop (photo d). [5] Make three more crystal charms as in steps $1-4$, but substitute a jump ring or a split ring for the soldered ring on the last charm.
[6] String an AC, a spacer, a 10 mm lampwork bead, a spacer, and an AC on a head

pin. Start a wrapped loop, slide a soldered ring onto the loop, and finish with 3-4 wraps at the base of the loop (photo e).
[7] Make three more lampwork charms.

## EDITOR'S NOTE:

To make a pair of matching earrings, follow the directions for the desired charm, but slide an earring finding into the wrapped loop instead of a soldered jump ring.

## Assemble the bracelet

[1] String a crimp bead and half the clasp to about $11 / 2$ in. $(3.8 \mathrm{~cm})$ from the end of the flexible beading wire. Go back through the crimp bead and crimp it (Basics). Trim the short tail.
[2] String an MC, an AC, an MC, a 4 mm bead cap, an 8 mm lampwork bead, and a 4 mm bead cap.
[3] String an AC, a lampwork dangle, an MC, a 4 mm bead cap, an 8 mm lampwork bead, and a 4 mm bead cap.
[4] Repeat step 3, alternating between crystal charms and lampwork charms (photo f) until you

have four lampwork and three crystal charms strung. [5] String an AC , an MC , and an AC. Then string a crimp bead and the other half of the clasp. Go back through the crimp bead and crimp it. Trim the tail.
[6] Open the jump ring on
the remaining crystal charm and attach it to the loop end of the toggle (photo g).
