STRAWBERRY PATCH

## MATERIALS

1 light green 4 mm glass round 1 teal 12 mm pressed-glass bicone 10 light green $8 \times 4 \mathrm{~mm}$ pressed-glass flowers 8 assorted green and red $8-16 \times 7-14 \mathrm{~mm}$ pressed-glass hearts
1 light green $16 \times 5 \mathrm{~mm}$ pressed-glass flower with attached loop
1 green/red/clear 15 mm handpainted glass round 6 serpentine $8 \times 4 \mathrm{~mm}$ faceted rondelles
2 pale yellow 15 mm vintage Lucite rings 1 green 14 mm vintage Lucite ring 1 forest green shiny 8 mm vintage Lucite round 3 forest green matte 8 mm vintage Lucite rounds 1 navy 8 mm vintage Lucite round 11 mottled lime green 8 mm vintage Lucite rounds 6 red 12 mm vintage Lucite rounds 1 red $10 \times 3 \mathrm{~mm}$ vintage Lucite flower 1 blue $12 \times 14 \mathrm{~mm}$ vintage Lucite heart charm
1 antique brass $15 \times 20 \mathrm{~mm}$ oval charm with green glass inlay
2 antique brass $12-16 \times 16-20 \mathrm{~mm}$ heart charms 1 antique brass 11 mm spring-ring clasp

Heart-shaped metal charms and glass beads look lovely with berry-toned, vintage Lucite rounds and rings.
String them randomly on beading wire for a whimsical charm bracelet.

35 antique brass and/or antique copper $11 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ head pins 2 antique brass and/or antique copper 6 mm jump rings 5 antique brass and/or antique copper 9 mm jump rings 2 gold-filled 2 mm crimp tubes 10 " of satin copper .019 beading wire

## TOOLS

Wire cutters
Round-nose pliers
Flat-nose pliers
Crimping pliers

## FINISHED SIZE: 8¹/4"

1: Use 1 head pin to string the Lucite flower and the 4 mm round; form a wrapped loop to create 1 dangle.
2: Use 1 head pin to string one $8 \times 4 \mathrm{~mm}$ pressed-glass flower and form a wrapped or double simple loop. Note: For a dangle that hangs close to the bracelet's wire, make a double simple loop; for a dangle that sticks farther out, make a wrapped loop. Repeat to string 1 of the following beads on each head pin: the remaining $8 \times 4 \mathrm{~mm}$ pressed-glass flowers, 5 mottled lime green rounds, and all the glass hearts, serpentine rondelles, forest green shiny and matte rounds, and the navy round for a total of 34 dangles.
3: Attach one 6 mm jump ring to 1 pale yellow ring; repeat with the $16 \times 5 \mathrm{~mm}$ pressed-glass flower. Attach one 9 mm jump ring to each of the remaining rings, the Lucite charm, the oval charm, and 1 antique brass heart charm for a total of 7 jump-ring dangles.
4: Attach the beading wire to the spring-ring clasp using a crimp tube. String beads in the following order, attaching the 42 dangles in whatever order you please: String 1 dangle, 1 lime green round, 3 dangles, 1 red round, 2 dangles, 1 lime green round, 3 dangles, 1 red round, 2 dangles, 1 lime green round, 2 dangles, the painted glass round, 5 dangles, 1 red round, 3 dangles, 1 lime green round, 4 dangles, 1 red round, 2 dangles, the bicone, 3 dangles, 1 red round, 3 dangles, 1 lime green round, 5 dangles, 1 red round, 2 dangles, 1 lime green round, 2 dangles, 1 crimp tube, and the remaining antique brass heart charm; pass back through the tube and crimp.
